The common theme of the INITIALS exhibition is the initial letters of the names and surnames of the exhibiting artists, i.e. initials or monograms.

In previous decades, it was common to embroider initials of names, for example, on handkerchiefs, shirts and some non-confectionary clothing, to stamp them into the leather of luggage, etc.; now it is only sometimes the case with more expensive and tailored clothing. Irena Czepcová (*1986, Trinec)

In 2005 she graduated from the Secondary School of Arts and Crafts in Valašské Meziříčí. In 2006-2013 she graduated from the glass studio of doc. ak. mal. Ilja Bílek at the Faculty of Art and Design of Jan Evangelista Purkyně University in Ústí nad Labem. During her studies, she completed internships abroad in Poland at the Academy of Fine Arts im. Jan Matejko i n Krakow and in Hungary at the University of Pécs / Faculty of Music and Visual Arts. Initially, she focused her attention on working with concrete and connecting it with glass. Since 2010, she has been consistently working with the decoration of paint rolls applied to spatial glass objects. In her current projects she works with light source and using new technologies oriented to the art of installation. Here he further pushes the concept of f light and space with an added layer of collective memory.



Dáša Lasotová (*1951, Ostrava)

He lives and works in the Czech Republic in Vřesina near Bílovec. Since the late 1970s her work has had a conceptual character. She has been exhibiting individually since 1989 and collectively since 1981. In 1991-2012 she worked at the Department of Art Education at the Faculty of Peda-gogy of the University of Ostrava. She dealt with the mediation of visual art, especially in the field of conceptualism. Currently, she is engaged in artistic creation, educational and curatorial activities.



Lucie Žilák Labajová (*1981, Trinec)

She graduated in Graphic Art at the Academy of Fine Arts in Ostrava and Scene Design at the Academy of Performing Arts in Brno. Since 2010 she has been working mainly on theatre scenography in the Czech and Slovak Republic. She regularly cooperates with the Petr Bezruč Theatre in Ostrava, the Husa na Provázku Theatre in Brno, the National Theatre Brno, the Radost Theatre, the Švandovo Theatre, the in Prague or the Municipal Theatre in Zlín. In his free work, he focuses on graphics, spatial installations and drawing.

Krystyna Pasterczyk (*1960, Jasło)

Visual artist, sculptor, author of installations and objects. She studied at the Faculty of Pedagogy and Art of the Cieszyn Branch of the University of Silesia in Katowice. During her studies she was involved in the implementation of Prof. Jerzy Wroński's programme

Art at the University. At that time she attended a Bauhaus colour course (J. Albers) taught by Michael Kidner in Cieszyn (1985). In 1986 she completed her artistic diploma in the Sculpture Studio of Prof. Jan Herma. After graduation, she started working at her home university as an assistant in the Department of Painting and Sculpture. At the same time, together with Krzysztof Morcinek and Andrzej Szewczyk co-founded the Miejsce Gallery in Cieszyn. Her works have been presented at the following exhibitions: Status quo, Centrum Rzeźby Polskiej Orońsko (1996); at the National Museum in Warsaw (1996); Alabaster, Bielska BWA Gallery (2012); Falling Upwards, Municipal Gallery, Tøinec (2013).

Graduate of the University of Silesia in Katowice and the Academy of Fine Arts in Krakow. He completed his doctorate and habilitation at the Faculty of Painting of the Academy of Fine Arts in Krakow. He is currently a professor at the University of Silesia, working at the Institute of F i ne Arts in Cieszyn. His interests in painting are rooted in the Greek-Christian tradition, which he considers to be the common heritage of the whole of Europe, and which he finds traces of in various points and moments of the so-called Western world. He tries to examine and show these problems.

Apart from her artistic work, she is involved in practical activities in the field of culture dissemination, co-organizing the Venice Cieszyn Biennale, the Venice Cieszyn Art Meetings and the Cinema on the Border Film Review. Ales Szotkowski (*1971, Frýdek-Místek)

Since 1993 member of the romantic art association "ROMAN" (Pavel Preisner, Michal Navrátil), since 1995 member of the Association of Olomouc Artists. He studied art education at the Faculty of Education of Palacký University

in Olomouc. Over the years, his work in free painting has varied from lyrical abstraction with elements of Tashism, through formal painting of children's expression, to geometric abstraction executed in an expressive manner. With considerable experimentation with different media, his works are unclassifiable, almost always conceptual. Concept is also evident in exhibition presentations, where the actual installation of the objects on display plays an important role. He also works with free sculpture, from wood to epoxy resin. In recent years, he has been working on assemblages in which he works with various found or artificial elements, which he puts together in compositions of slightly ironic meanings.
